- ° One in 5 teens has experienced violence in a dating relationship
- ° About 20 elderly people die in Florida every week from homicide/suicide
 - ° One person is murdered every 31 minutes in the U.S.
- ° 1 in 4 girls & 1 in 6 boys are victims of sexual abuse before the age of 18
- ° 1 in 4 women & 1 in 7 men have been victims of severe domestic violence in their lifetime
- ° Over 2300 domestic/dating violence cases & 13 domestic homicides in Marion County in 2018




