



# Let's All Be on the Front Line in Keeping Our Children Safe

#### **REPORTING ABUSE DURING COVID-19**

With schools, many daycares and most extra-curricular activities being closed due to COVID-19, we need you now more than ever to help keep our children safe. As Floridians, we all have the responsibility to report any suspicion or knowledge of abuse or neglect (39.201 F.S.). By making a report, you are not only ensuring the child's safety, you are also providing help and support to the family.

# You May Be the Only Person to Act.

#### If something does not look safe, sound safe or feel safe – Report.

"Abuse" means any willful act or threatened act that results in any physical, mental, or sexual abuse, injury, or harm that causes or is likely to cause the child's physical, mental, or emotional health to be significantly impaired. Within the context of the definition of "harm," the term "neglects the child" means that the parent or other person responsible for the child's welfare fails to supply the child with adequate food, clothing, shelter, or health care, although financially able to do so or although offered financial or other means to do so. (F.S. 39.01)

Be prepared to provide specific descriptions of the incident(s) or the circumstances contributing to the risk of harm.

#### COVID-19 RESOURCES FOR PARENTS AND CAREGIVERS

Parents and caregivers, you play a vital role in helping children feel safe and secure. As we adjust to this new "normal," children may feel sad and worried about their friends, family and even themselves. Below are some tips and resources that will help your family have conversations about COVID-19, manage stress, and obtain additional support for your family.

#### **Talking to Kids**

- REMAIN CALM Children react to both what you say and how you say it.
- LIMIT INFORMATION Too much information
   on one topic can lead to anxiety.
- BE AVAILABLE Take time to talk and answer their questions.

#### **Toddlers & Preschoolers**

- COMMUNICATE Praise, hugs and highfives show positive attention to your child.
- STRUCTURE & RULES Be consistent and develop rules your child can understand.
- GIVING DIRECTIONS Give clear directions
   that fit your child's age.

#### Coping & Managing Stress

- HEALTHY Exercise, take deep breaths, meditate and eat well-balanced meals.
- STAY CONNECTED Take the time to talk to others about how you are feeling.
- UNWIND Do activities with your family that you enjoy.

**SNAP** is for children who are having problems with aggressive, antisocial behaviors that get them into trouble at home, school and the community.

**SNAP** groups are gender specific for either boys or girls ages 6 to 11.

**SNAP** groups use a cognitive behavioral model to teach selfcontrol, problem solving and emotional self-regulation skills.

**SNAPP** (parenting) groups teach parents effective child management strategies.

**SNAP** includes one on one and family counseling/ support, school advocacy and referral for additional services if needed.



## **NEW LOCATION FOR COVID-19 STARTING AUGUST 11, 2020**

Starting **Tuesday**, **August 11**, Florida Department of Health will be changing its testing process and moving the testing location to the Southeastern Livestock Pavilion, 2232 NE Jacksonville Road, Ocala. Appointments will no longer be required. People will be tested at the new site on a first-come, first-served basis.

Testing will be held each Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 8 a.m. to 10 am. at the Livestock Pavilion. People who would like to be tested can line their vehicles up starting at 7:30 a.m. on each testing day. Testing will run through 10 a.m. or until the day's available samples are gone, whichever comes first. To be tested, individuals should bring a valid photo ID; minors under age 18 will only be tested if they are accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.

People should be prepared to stay in their vehicles while waiting for testing; restroom facilities will not be available. Only people who are being tested should be in the vehicle, with the exception of parents, guardians or caregivers. No pets are permitted in the vehicle during tests.
