DO YOU WANT TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN A CHILD'S LIFE?



Do you have a heart for children with special health care needs?

Why foster care? There is a critical need for all types of homes and care providers in the state of Florida to provide care for these children.

What is foster care? A temporary placement in a family home that has been licensed by the local Community Based Care organization. Children are placed in these specialized homes where families provide care to children/teenagers who have been removed from their own homes. Foster care provides homes for traditional children in care as well as children with therapeutic, behavioral, developmental and medical challenges.

Is foster care a paid position? Foster care is not a paid position. You do receive a "board rate" payment that helps support room and board of a foster care placement. There are opportunities to serve children and youth who have special health care needs. If you complete additional training, there is an ability to receive a separate payment paid to you as the provider when accepting an approved medical placement.

Who can be a foster parent? Any responsible adult who successfully passes a background screening, completes all trainings and someone who wants to open their home to a child who does not have a home. We are looking for families who want to reach out to Florida's neediest and to help a child grow and thrive through your support and guidance. You do not need to have experience to be a foster parent. You just need to have a deep desire to help a child develop a loving, supportive relationship with you and others. You will help a child learn to trust, love, listen, and provide them with a safe and nurturing environment. You become a respected member of a team caring for each child placed in your home.



ARE YOU PREGNANT AND NEED HELP?

Nurse-Family Partnership is a new program to our area; however, this program has been around since 1977. Nurse-Family Partnership is a home-visiting program targeting low-income first-time pregnant women with substance use disorders. Nurse-Family Partnership provides services for the mother and her baby up until age two with at weekly or bi-weekly home visits by specially trained Registered Nurses. All services provided by Nurse-Family Partnership are **FREE**!

Some of the benefits of Nurse-Family Partnership include:

Maternal Health Outcomes

- reduced pregnancy-induced hypertension
- fewer preterm births
- reduction in preterm delivery among women who smoke cigarettes
- · reduction in very closely spaced subsequent pregnancies

Child Health Outcomes

- reduction in child abuse and neglect
- fewer health care encounters for injuries or ingestions in the first 2 years of life among children born to mothers with low psychological resources
- less behavioral and intellectual problems in children at age 6
- fewer emergency room visits for accidents and poisonings through age 2

Eligibility Requirements

- pregnant with first child
- is pregnant 28 weeks or less
- substance exposed
- meets low-income requirements

Most of the time, you will be in close contact with social workers, counselors, teachers and more. Good record keeping is also a must. Our facility is very secure with video monitors for the protection of our staff and residents.

Shock-Watch

In the United States each year, more than 4,000 children are treated for electrical shock or burn injuries and about 25 deaths due to contact with high voltage sources.

Turn off, Pull by the plug, Store the appliance before you leave the room





Cover all electrical outlets in your home

Hide the extension, charger and other electrical cords behind furniture



Replace worn, torn or any damaged electrical cords

Avoid circuit overload by limiting electrical lines into one extension





Never use any electrical appliance around water, including wet hands

Keep electrical toys away from water
