

#### THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT

As 2021 comes to a close and we begin 2022, I want to thank our partners and members for your continued support of the Marion County Children's Alliance. Although COVID continued and life could not return to normal, your commitment to the children of Marion County made it possible for the Alliance to focus on our mission of improving the lives of Marion County children. The work we do does not happen without the collaboration of our many partners and members. Your support is imperative to helping us continue our mission. Below are a few of the 2021 impacts because of that support:


- -- We provided emergency services to 134 families. Throughout the year we provided shelter for 17 women and their children in our apartment for domestic violence victims.
- -- We provided Christmas Assistance for more than 400 children
- -- Through our SKIP grant, we tutored and/or mentored over 200 at risk children/youth that were either in the DJJ system or were identified at risk for entering the system.
- -- Through Community Council Against Substance Abuse CCASA), we organized and implemented the Recovery Fest at Tuscawilla Park with over 1,000 in attendance. Also CCASA sponsored 8 SADD (Students Against Destructive Decisions) Clubs with a membership of 400 youth that hosted over 50 drug, alcohol and tobacco prevention activities.
- -- CCASA hosted Drive for Life, a youth led initiative, for our high schools, to help reduce traffic accidents and traffic death related incidences of our youth.
- -- With a partnership with the Marion County Health Department, we participated in the OD2A grant and provided a peer facilitator to work with and identify pregnant women to mentor towards recovery and pre-natal care.
- -- We hosted a vendor/resource fair for the Social Workers and School to Home Liaisons for Marion County Public Schools.
- -- We honored Kimberly's Center with the inaugural Dr. Mike Jordan Award of Excellence and Shores Assembly of God Church with the inaugural Dr. Mike Jordan Vision Award.
- -- We continued virtually and in person with our monthly networking and educational meetings with an average of 60 in attendance.

2022 will continue to bring challenges and opportunities to our community. With our partnerships and collaborations, we will strive to make Marion County a safe, nurturing and compassionate community for all of our children.

I look forward to our continued work together.

Marion County Public Schools has moved to a new process for volunteer applications. Anyone wanting to donate their time on campus must fill out an electronic application that can be found at

The all-electronic process enables MCPS to screen volunteers in a timely fashion with increased capacity and results.

#### **School Choice**

The School Choice application window is now open. Parents may apply for their children to attend schools outside their zoned area through an online School Choice process. School Choice offers students multiple options, including magnet schools, career academies, and special choice options.

The deadline to submit applications and supporting documentation for School Choice is January 31, 2022, at 11:59 p.m.

Remove all items that can cause choking, poisoning, burns and falls in each room

#### HERE'S WHAT TO DO WITH YOUR HOLIDAY WASTE

Marion County: Disposal tips for Baseline Landfill and recycling centers

After the Christmas holiday is over, we usually have a lot of things to dispose of and recycle, and knowing how to dispose of things such as batteries, Christmas trees, and lights can help prevent hazards and reduce wait times at recycling centers.



**Batteries:** Rechargeable batteries can be placed in the hazardous waste shed at any recycling center. Non-rechargeable household batteries (AA, AAA, C and D) should be placed in your household garbage.

**Cardboard:** Can be placed in the single-stream recycling containers at any recycling center.

**Christmas cards:** Can be placed in the single-stream recycling containers at any recycling center.

**Christmas lights:** Can be placed in the metal bin at any recycling center or into the electronics box at the following locations: Baseline, Dunnellon, Forest Corners, Fort McCoy, Martel, Newton and Weirsdale.

**Christmas trees** (with decorations removed): Can be placed in the yard waste area at any recycling center.

Christmas ribbons and bows: Should be placed in your household garbage.

**Christmas wrapping paper:** Can be placed in the single-stream recycling containers at any recycling center.

**Electronics:** Can be placed in the electronics box at the following locations: Baseline, Dunnellon, Forest Corners, Fort McCoy, Martel, Newton and Weirsdale.

**Plastic shopping bags:** May be recycled at participating department and grocery stores.

**Styrofoam and packing peanuts:** Should be placed in your household garbage.

Marion County recycling centers are open to residents of unincorporated Marion County. Electronics recycling events are open to residents of unincorporated Marion County and the City of Ocala. Residents who live outside of the county or within other municipalities can take advantage of these opportunities through the purchase of an annual recycling center permit.


