





The 2022 Dr. Mike Jordan Award of Excellence was awarded to the Heart of Florida Health Center for helping eliminate little to no access to health care for our low-income children and youth. In 2021 a pediatric specialty dentist was hired to eliminate travel for children and youth for dental care. Heart of Florida, with a partnership with the Marion County Public Schools and United Way of Marion County, established a clinic at College Park Elementary School as a part of the Community School initiative.
